Upon our acquisition of the assets of the Rising Star property, we joined HGMI in its property tax appeal and timely filed an appeal for the year 2011. We subsequently filed appeals for the years 2012, 2013, and 2014. On September 21, 2015, the Parties entered into a Settlement Agreement whereby HGMI received a refund in the amount of \$513,125.86 in exchange for the dismissal of the appeal. Full House received a refund in the amount of \$1,352,936.72 in exchange for the dismissal of its appeal. Also, as part of

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the Agreement, the Parties agreed to the calculation of the real property tax assessments for Rising Star Casino Resort for the years 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Full House will develop, construct and operate American Place, a land-based casino/hotel resort including a 1,500-seat entertainment center and several bars and restaurants to be located on the Fountain Square property in Waukegan, IL.

Economic benefits from American Place (Phase 1) to the State of Illinois, the City of Waukegan and other local communities are as follows:

- Estimated one-time payment of licensing (owners license and sports wagering license), additional licensing, gaming position and initial reconciliation fees to the State of Illinois: \$76.55 million;
- Estimated additional reconciliation payment to the State of Illinois: \$153.55 million;
- Estimated wagering taxes, admission fees and estimated income taxes to the State of Illinois (year 1 of operations): \$52.5 million
- Estimated wagering taxes, admission fees, lease payments and other taxes to the City of Waukegan (year 1 of operations): \$22.2 million
