Federal

Par-A-Dice Gaming Corporation is included in the Federal consolidated income tax return filed by Boyd Gaming Corporation. The IRS completed its fieldwork and issued a Revenue Agents Report related to its audit of the 2005-2009 federal consolidated income tax returns. The IRS assessed additional tax of \$6.2 million. Adjustments were made in connection with the depreciable lives of fixed assets and capitalized interest. Such adjustments relate to affiliates of Par-A-Dice Gaming Corporation included in the consolidated return and not directly to the operations of Par-A-Dice Gaming Corporation. The Company filed a protest with the Appeals division of the IRS. On December 18, 2013, the Company received computations from the IRS Appeals Office showing final adjustments. The computations reflected a consolidated refund of approximately \$2.6 million. The refund is primarily due to the carryback of a 2009 net operating loss into 2005 and the carryback of 2009 excess tax credits into 2008. We received notification from the Appeals Officer on October 21, 2014 that their review was complete and the case was submitted to the Joint Committee for approval.

The IRS completed its fieldwork and issued a Revenue Agents Report related to its audit of the 2005-2009 federal tax return of the Borgata. The IRS issued a Revenue Agents Report and the adjustment of \$18.1 million contained in its report relates primarily to carry forward adjustments from the 2003-2004 IRS audit. Since the Borgata is a partnership for federal taxation purposes, these adjustments are included in the appeals process for Boyd Gaming Corporation and

Borgata's other partner.

Kansas

Kansas Star Casino appealed its property tax valuation for the 2012 year to the Kansas Court of Tax Appeals. The Sumner County assessor valued the property at \$90.8 million and the property's 3rd party expert appraisal valued the property at \$64.3 million. The difference in valuation relates primarily to (1) inclusion of land options paid to 3rd parties and (2) the excess valuation of land due to the inclusion of intangible value based on the gaming license. We had a hearing with the Kansas Court of Tax Appeals (KCOTA) in October 2013. KCOTA issued a decision on February 25, 2014 and valued the real property at \$80,510,000. Both parties filed a petition for redetermination on March 14, 2014. The County also requested that the refund be stayed until resolution through the final appeal. KCOTA denied both parties petition for redetermination on April 1, 2014 but did agree to stay the refund on the 2012 decision. We filed an appeal with the Court of Appeals ("COA") on April 24, 2014. The record in the 2012 appeal was transferred to the COA and certified in July 2014. We filed our opening brief on October 23, 2014. A hearing date has not been scheduled.

Kansas Star Casino received its 2013 valuation notices on February 25, 2013. The assessor valued the property, including the recently constructed permanent casino, at approximately \$226 million. Kansas Star Casino filed an appeal on the 2013 property tax valuation on March 21, 2013. Expert reports were exchanged on January 27, 2014. Our appraisal values the property at \$62.0 million and the County's appraisal values the property at \$140.0 million, approximately \$86 million lower than their 2013 assessed value. Our appraisal excludes all intangible value associated with the gaming license, applies a discount for external and functional obsolescence to the cost of construction and values the land consistent with the approach in the 2012 appeal. We filed a partial motion for summary judgment with KCOTA on March 25, 2014, requesting that the County lower the 2013 assessed value to their \$140 million appraised value. The Kansas Board of Tax Appeals ("KBOTA"), formerly known as the KCOTA, denied our partial motion for summary judgment on August 13, 2014. The trial date for the 2013 appeal was moved to December 9th - 11th.

Kansas Star Casino received its 2014 notice of value on March 18, 2014. The assessor valued the property at \$151 million, a \$75 million reduction from the prior year. Kansas Star Casino appealed its 2014 property tax valuation on June 18, 2014. The trial date for the 2014 appeal is tentatively scheduled for February 27, 2015.

Louisiana

Subsequent to audits conducted by the Louisiana Department of Revenue, Boyd Gaming Corporation, Boyd Kenner, Inc. and Boyd Louisiana Racing, Inc. were assessed incremental franchise taxes for the tax years 2002 - 2004. The assessments were paid under protest and we filed suit in District Court. The three cases were consolidated and we filed a Motion for Partial Summary Judgment on January 30, 2014. The hearing was held on August 25, 2014. The judge ruled on the Motion for Partial Summary Judgment in the taxpayer's favor on October 1, 2014. The State has not filed an appeal as of the current date.

Boyd Gaming Corporation's 2007-2009 income/franchise tax returns are being audited by the State of Louisiana. The audit began June 13, 2011. A proposed assessment was issued September 20, 2013 in the amount of \$1,067,807 plus interest. Adjustments were made to the apportionment factor and franchise tax base, resulting from the disallowance of a deduction related to intercompany debt. Statute extensions have been signed through December 31, 2015.

Mississippi

Boyd Tunica's sales and use tax returns for the periods June 2009 thru August 2012 were audited by the State of Mississippi. An assessment in the amount of \$30,636 was paid in February 2014.

Nevada

The California Hotel & Casino was audited for room tax for the period May 2009 thru April 2012 by the city of Las Vegas. The City of Las Vegas issued a preliminary assessment for \$900,000, including penalties and interest. A settlement was reached with the City of Las Vegas in which the property was assessed and paid \$56,464 of Room Tax and Interest during the 1st quarter 2014.

New Jersey

Marina District Development Holding Company's state income tax returns filed for years 2003-2006 are currently under audit. No adjustments have been proposed as of the current date. The state agreed to postpone the audit until after the Federal audit was completed. Statute extensions have been signed through April 30, 2015.

Borgata has filed tax appeal complaints, in connection with its property tax assessments for tax years 2009 through 2013, in New Jersey Tax Court ("Court"). The trial for tax years 2009 and 2010 was held during the second quarter of 2013 and a decision was issued on October 18, 2013. The assessor valued Borgata's real property at approximately \$2.3 billion. The Court found in favor of the Borgata and reduced the real property valuation to \$880 million and \$870 million for tax years 2009 and 2010, respectively. The City of Atlantic City is appealing the Court's decision and filed an appeal with the New Jersey Superior Court – Appellate Division on November 26, 2013. No hearing date has been set. Borgata has paid its property tax obligations consistent with the assessor's valuation and based on the Court's decision, we estimate the 2009 and 2010 property tax refunds and related statutory interest will be approximately \$48.0 million and \$11.2 million, respectively.

Borgata was also appealing its property tax assessments for years 2011-2013. An agreement was executed on June 4, 2014 to settle the property tax appeals for the 2011-2013 tax years. Under the terms of the settlement agreement, (1) the 2009-2010 appeal will run its course, (2) Borgata will receive an \$88.25 million refund for years 2011-2013, (3) the values for 2014 and 2015 will be set at \$925 million and \$850 million, respectively and (4) approximately \$17.5 million of 2014 overpayments will be credited to subsequent quarterly tax payments or paid with the 2011-13 refund.

However, Boyd Gaming Corporation's common stock is listed on the New York Stock Exchange and its shares are, therefore, publicly traded. In addition, some of its shares are held by institutional investors, such as mutual funds, which have owners of beneficial interest. As such, it is possible that one or more shareholders are (i) public officials or officers or employees of a unit of government, or (ii) related to public officials, officers or employees. Furthermore, Boyd Gaming Corporation or its subsidiaries have issued registered notes which are listed on the New York Stock Exchange, and some of which are held by institutional investors, such as mutual funds, which have owners of beneficial interest. Therefore, it is possible that one or more owners of the registered notes are (i) public officials or officers or employees of a unit of government, or (ii) related to public officials, officers or employees. It is not possible for Boyd Gaming Corporation to determine whether (i) any public officials or officers or employees of any unit of government or (ii) any relative of any such public officials, officers or employees or any unit of government hold or have any interest in any contractual or service relationship with, the Applicant or Licensee.

During 2014, Par-A-Dice's average number of employees was 761, and its average number of FTEs was 606.

Par-A-Dice's projected admissions for 2015 are 978,922 and its projected adjusted gross gaming receipts are \$90,186,800.

Education Contributions

Researching educational program opportunities in our region continues to be top of mind. In 2014 Par-A-Dice provided cash grants to the following regional educational programs; East Peoria Chamber of Commerce Leadership Program, WD Boyce Council Scout Reach Program, Children's Home Foundation - Leaders of Tomorrow Program, PJ Star Newspapers in Education and an Investor sponsor of the Junior Achievement of Central Illinois. An educational scholarship grant in the amount of \$15,000 was again awarded to Peoria Promise Foundation. Peoria Promise provides City of Peoria students who have graduated from a public school with 64 credit hours to be used over a 3 year period at Illinois Central College. This non-profit organization is funded completely by local businesses and reaches a multi-cultural group of students.

Illinois Institute for Addiction Recovery/Hult Health Center was gifted \$15,000 to be used for specific educational programs about responsible gaming. Charitable Organizations

Par-A-Dice is pleased to support many charitable organizations in the region. We continue to research and educate ourselves in organizations that are truly making a difference in the region. Following are some highlights of our 2014 commitments.

Par-A-Dice gifted \$25,000 to the Midwest Food Bank which serves over 190 agencies in Central Illinois. Our gifts continue to support the Tender Mercies program initiated at the Midwest Food Bank to help guide and extend the mission of alleviating food insecurity here in the United States and abroad. This is an exceptional program and we are honored to continue to support.

The Tri-County Urban League in Peoria Illinois provides services to over 5,000 residences a year. The Tri-County Urban Leagues' mission is to improve the educational, economic and social well-being of African American and similarly disadvantaged people. We continue to be actively engaged on the Board of Directors and the property provided \$7,500 in grants.

A total of \$22,500 was gifted in support of 3 basketball camps for youth in the Peoria area. Mitchell J J Anderson, a graduate of Bradley University, NBA star and hall of fame recipient, Curley Boo Johnson of Harlem Globe Trotter fame, and David Booth basketball legend, all are African American men and Peoria natives. Each year they continue to give back to their communities through week long basketball camps for youth ranging in age from 9 – 16. The proceeds raised from corporate gifts cover the expenses for each camp and benefit 3 different organizations in the community,

Boys and Girls Club of Peoria, George Washington Carver Center, and Peoria Promise Foundation whose client base is lower income African American families. The participation continues to grow in these camps and our funding is key to their success.

CASA ensures abused and neglected children are placed in a safe and permanent home, using specially trained volunteers who advocate for children in the court system. Our gift of \$10,000 helps to provide these much needed services.

\$10,000 to the Children's Home Leaders of Tomorrow Program to assist troubled youth with job skills much needed as they transition into careers and independence.

Neighborhood House, located on the south side of Peoria, provides core comprehensive services in the community including Meals on Wheels program. This program has grown to over 120,000 clients a year, with the majority of their clientele being lower income, senior African American residents. Our gift of \$10,000 in 2014 will help support this important program for residents in need.

\$4,000 was given to the WD Boyce Boy Scouts Organization in our region. A portion of the funds were specific to the Whitney Young African American Scouting programs in underserved areas of the community. Funds were in support of the annual Distinguished Citizen Event.

The Center for Prevention of Abuse in central Illinois provides services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault/abuse, and elder abuse. The Center also reaches students age pre-K through college with violence prevention education, as well as abusers with an abuser education program. \$15,000 cash was given to the center in support of these important services. Par-A-Dice is actively involved on the Board of Directors.

"Race for the Cure" was again a success in 2014. Peoria Illinois is the home town for the Susan G Komen Race for the Cure. Our 2014 contributions of \$15,000 support important programs including Susan G Komen's "Circle of Promise" program that is specific to promoting awareness and education to African American Women.

Land of Lincoln Honor Flight provides free trips to WWII and Vietnam Veterans, to visit monuments in Washington DC. This group is supported by 100% donated funds and has flown over 90,000 veterans since 2005. Our gift of \$15,000 went directly to provide local tri-county Illinois veterans with this proud and honored opportunity.

Heart of Illinois United Way campaign grew again in 2014 to a total of \$107,000 in employee contributions.
